Hungarian scholars may apply to teach courses or conduct post-doctoral research at U.S. institutions. Scholarships are awarded in any field of the arts and sciences.

WHAT IS ACADEMIC INTEGRITY?

Learn how to avoid plagiarism while at school in the U.S.



In short, it refers to honesty and the respect with which students approach their studies.

The biggest threat to academic integrity is **plagiarism**, which is the act of claiming someone else's ideas or work as your own. U.S. colleges and universities take plagiarism very seriously and the consequences can range from failing an assignment or class to being expelled.

So, how can you avoid plagiarism?

- Many university websites provide international students with guidance on ways to avoid plagiarism.
- You can also find a university's academic integrity policy in its international student handbook.
- Many professors address plagiarism at the beginning of their course. When in doubt, ask for help!
