The FLEX Scholarship application for the 2022/2023 school year started on September 13.

The Future Leaders Exchange (FLEX) program is a full scholarship provided by the U.S. government to allow students to spend a high school year in the United States. The FLEX program is a cultural exchange program in which fellows live with volunteer host families, learn about American culture, customs, family, school and community life, and American values.

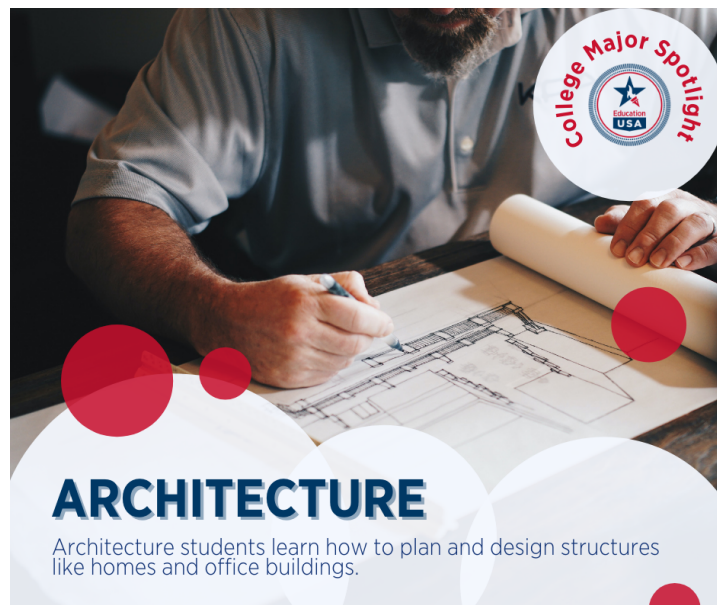
The following countries are eligible for FLEX: Azerbaijan, Czech Republic, Estonia, Georgia, Greece, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Poland, Latvia, Lithuania, Hungary, Moldova, Mongolia, Montenegro, Armenia, Romania, Serbia, Slovakia, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan and Uzbekistan.

What You Need to Know About Becoming an Architecture Major

14,959 international students studied architecture in the United States in the academic year 2019/2020, according to the IIE Open Doors Report. Are you interested in planning and designing structures like homes and office buildings? Then studying architecture might be a great choice for you! Learn more about what you can expect and what it takes to take the architecture major:

Students interested in pursuing an architecture major can typically choose from two types of programs: a five-year National Architectural Accrediting Board-accredited Bachelor of Architecture degree that equips graduates to enter the workforce or a four-year bachelor's degree in architecture or architectural studies. With the latter, students have to earn an NAAB-accredited Master of Architecture degree to obtain a license and work as an architect.

In a five-year professional B.Arch. degree, students can expect to get a strong foundation in design, theory and technology, while learning the history of architecture. Many programs require students to take some courses in a design studio, where they get hands-on experience representing their ideas through drawings and structure models.

Curricular Practical Training

CPT is a type of off-campus employment authorization in which the work must be related to a program of study and must be completed before graduation.

Experts say international undergraduate students who hold F-1 immigration status are eligible for CPT after they have been enrolled full time in a degree program for one full academic year. The one-year requirement does not apply to [graduate students](#) in F-1 status if their graduate program requires participation in CPT.
