Florida's Public Universities

In-State Tuition Scholarship for Students from Central and Eastern Europe Deadline: April 30

Florida's 40 public universities (including community colleges) offer in-state tuition scholarships to students from Central and Eastern Europe. This is part of a special initiative on the part of Florida's state government to foster educational, cultural, and business ties with certain strategic world regions. The scholarship provides them in-state tuition, renewable for their entire degree period.

Students from the following countries are eligible: Albania, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Czech Republic, Estonia, Georgia, Hungary, Kazakhstan, Kosovo, Kyrgyzstan, Latvia, Lithuania, Macedonia, Moldova, Poland, Romania, Russia, Serbia and Montenegro, Slovak Republic, Slovenia, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, Ukraine, and Uzbekistan.

This scholarship receives very few applicants, and thus if you are a good student you are quite likely to be awarded it. The application deadline is April 30. For more information and to direct students to apply: http://bit.ly/FloridaEasternEurope.

Dean Rusk International Law Center at The University of Georgia School of Law

The University of Georgia School of Law is a public law school in Athens. Law students who wish to broaden their education can do so in three ways: through elective courses, joint degrees, and concurrent enrollment in other departments at the University of Georgia.

There are more than 40 student organizations to join, including the Rural South Law Society, for students who wish to practice in rural areas, and the Student Animal Legal Defense Fund, which advocates for improvements to federal and state animal laws. The school also has several legal journals: the *Georgia Law Review*, the *Georgia Journal of International & Comparative Law*, and the *Journal of Intellectual Property Law*.

Letters of Recommendation are Considered the Unfair Part of College Admissions

Read this article in the Washington Post on the stylistic differences in letters of recommendation sometimes noticeable among various states and institutions in the United States -- let alone the cultural differences evident in other world regions -- which can easily lead to the misinterpretation. DePaul University has moved away from requiring recommendation letters to a more guided recommendation form. On this note, since most schools still require letters, specific trainings for counselors and teachers on writing great letters of recommendation can make a huge difference.
