In fact, a number of universities are still accepting applications and offering scholarships to international undergraduate and graduate students interested in studying in the U.S. In this issue we highlight several schools that offer affordable degree programs for students coming from abroad.

1. Stevens Institute of Technology

Type: Medium-sized private university

Location: Hoboken, New Jersey

Enrollment: 7,208 students

International Scholarships: International students are automatically considered for merit-based [scholarships](#) from 5,000 USD/year to full tuition

Application requirements: TOEFL minimum 80 and SAT/ACT required.

Deadline: February 1 for **fall 2018 admission**.

2. Webster University

Type: Small private liberal arts

Location: Webster Groves, Missouri

Enrollment: 22,000 students

International Scholarships: International applicants considered for merit scholarships ranging from 5,000 to 15,000 USD per year.

Application requirements: TOEFL 80 or higher, transcript, essay, and two letters of recommendation.

Deadline: July 10 for fall 2017 admission.

2. University of Georgia School of Law

Type: Small public law school

Location: Athens, Georgia

Enrollment: 704 students

International Scholarships: Partial to full merit-based scholarships available for applicants to LL.M. program.

Scholarship requirements: TOEFL minimum 90 or IELTS minimum 6.5.

Deadline: May 31 for fall 2017 admission.

4. State University of New York at Plattsburgh

Type: Medium-sized public liberal arts

Location: Plattsburgh, New York

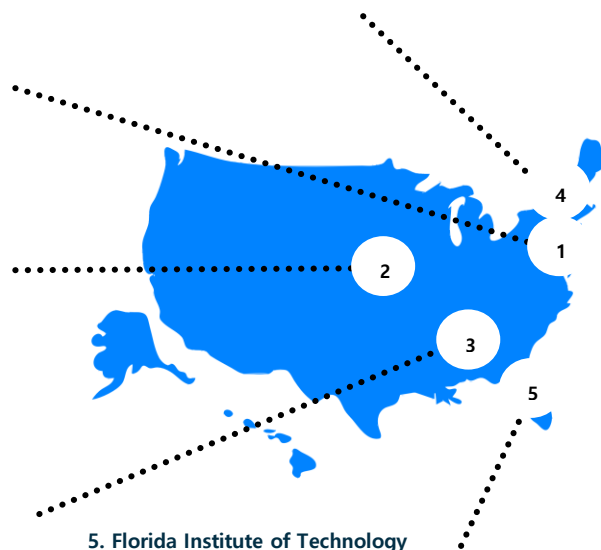
Enrollment: 6,214 students

International Scholarships: All international students receive 7,500 USD scholarship and are considered for additional merit-based aid.

Application requirements: TOEFL 76 or higher, SAT or ACT required.

Deadline: April 15 for fall 2017 admission

5. Florida Institute of Technology

Type: Small private university

Location: Melbourne, Florida

Enrollment: 4,633 students

International Scholarships: Automatically considered for merit-based [scholarship](#) for up to 50 percent tuition. Sports scholarships also available.

Application requirements: Essay, transcript, and one letter of recommendation required. TOEFL and SAT/ACT recommended.

Deadline: Rolling, so apply as soon as possible.

Scholarship opportunities vary for new students with awards ranging from \$500 to \$3,600 per year, or up to 30 percent of an already affordable cost of tuition and fees.
