Schools in Focus

1. Upper Iowa University

Type: Very small private liberal arts

Location: Fayette, Iowa **Enrollment:** 900 students

International Scholarships: International students are automatically considered for merit-based <u>scholarships</u>

from 7,500 to 14,000 USD/year.

Application requirements: TOEFL minimum 61, no

SAT or ACT required.

Deadline: Rolling admissions. Apply ASAP. **Learn more about how to apply online.

2. Missouri Western State University

Type: Medium-sized public university

Location: St. Joseph, Missouri **Enrollment:** 6,134 students

International Scholarships: Applicants for the STEM (Science, Technology, Math and Engineering) Master of Science program are automatically considered for a 2,000 USD per year merit scholarship and a one-time award of 500 USD.

Application requirements: TOEFL 79 or higher, related bachelor's degree with 3.0/4.0 GPA or higher.

Deadline: May 15 for fall 2017 admission

2. University of Missouri

Type: Large public university **Location:** Columbia, Missouri **Enrollment:** 32,777 students

International Scholarships: International students with strong high school transcripts and SAT scores of 1200 or higher or ACT scores of 27 or higher automatically receive 5,000 USD per year.

Scholarship requirements: TOEFL minimum 79.

Deadline: Dec, 15 for fall 2018 admission.


4. Husson University

Type: Small private university Location: Bangor, Maine Enrollment: 3,110 students

International Scholarships: International students are considered for merit-based scholarships ranging

from 3,000 to 10,000 USD per year.

Application requirements: TOEFL 75 or higher. **Deadline:** May 15 for fall 2017 admission **Check out more info on applying here.



5. Pittsburg State University

Type: Medium-sized public university

Location: Pittsburg, Kansas **Enrollment:** 7,244 students

International Scholarships: Competitive meritbased scholarships ranging 1,000 USD per year to full tuition are available for international students.

Application requirements: Application requirements vary based on scholarship. See website for details.

Deadline: February 1 for fall 2018 admission.
