Type: Small private university **Location:** Findlay, Ohio **Enrollment:** 3,700 students

International Scholarships: International students are automatically considered for merit-based <u>scholarships</u>

from 1,000 to 15,000 USD/year

Application requirements: Only high school transcript and TOEFL with a minimum score of 61 are required

Deadline: July 30

2. Susquehanna University

Type: Small private liberal arts **Location:** Selinsgrove, Pennsylvania **Enrollment:** 2,200 students

International Scholarships: International applicants are automatically considered for <u>merit scholarships</u>. Awards average 16,000 USD/year and can go up to

25,000 USD/year

Application requirements: TOEFL 80 or higher, two letters of recommendation, and SAT or ACT **Deadline:** Dec. 1 for **spring 2018** admission.

2. Texas Wesleyan University

Type: Small private liberal arts Location: Fort Worth, Texas Enrollment: 1,917 students

International Scholarships: International applicants are automatically considered for <u>merit scholarships</u> ranging from 4,000 to 12,000 USD/year.

Scholarship requirements: High school transcript and

exam results and TOEFL minimum 68 **Deadline:** Rolling admissions; apply ASAP

Type: Small private liberal arts Location: Colchester, Vermont Enrollment: 2,316 students


International Scholarships: International applicants are considered for <u>merit scholarships</u> ranging from

1,000 USD/year to half of tuition.

Application requirements: TOEFL (no minimum), recommendations, writing sample, and high school

transcript. SAT and ACT not required. **Deadline:** June 7 for fall 2017 admission

Type: Large public university **Location:** Townson, Maryland **Enrollment:** 22,284 students

International Scholarships: International applicants are automatically considered for <u>merit scholarships</u>

of 8,000 USD/year.

Application requirements: TOEFL 77 or higher, high

school transcript, and SAT.

Deadline: May 15
