1. Miami University (Ohio)

Type: Large public university

Location: Oxford, Ohio

Enrollment: 24,505 students

International Scholarships: International students are automatically considered for merit-based [scholarships](#) from 2,000 to 16,000 USD/year

Application requirements: TOEFL with a minimum score of 80 or IELTS with a score of 6.5, one letter of recommendation and SAT/ACT suggested

Deadline: Dec. 1 for fall 2018 admission

2. Pacific Lutheran University

Type: Small private liberal arts college

Location: Parkland, Washington

Enrollment: 3,100 students

International Scholarships: International applicants are automatically considered for [merit scholarships](#) ranging from 25% of tuition to full tuition

Application requirements: TOEFL 79 or higher or higher, one letter of recommendation, transcript, essays and SAT or ACT recommended

Deadline: Rolling admissions for **fall 2017**, so apply as soon as possible.

3. Missouri State University

Type: Large public university

Location: Springfield, Missouri

Enrollment: 26,000 students

International Scholarships: International applicants are automatically considered for [merit scholarships](#) up to 5,000 USD/year.

Application requirements: TOEFL 61 or higher or IELTS 5.5, and transcript

Deadline: **June 1** for **fall 2017** admission.

4. New York Institute of Technology

Type: Medium-sized private university

Location: New York City, New York

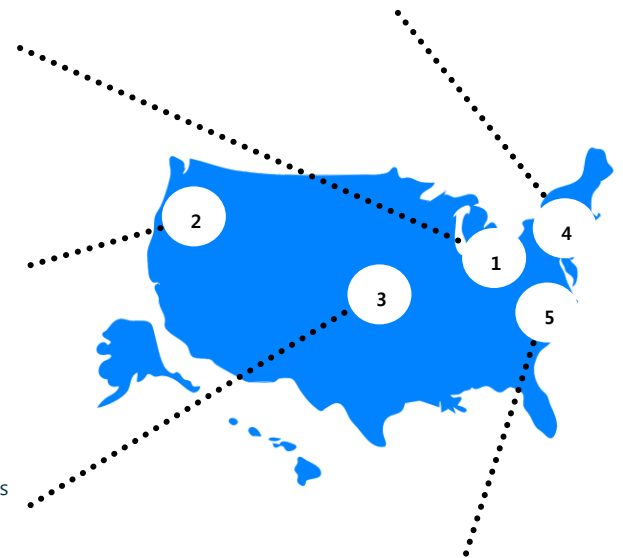
Enrollment: 5,727 students

International Scholarships: International applicants are considered for [merit scholarships](#) ranging from 5,000 to 22,000 USD/year.

Application requirements: TOEFL (no minimum), SAT and transcript.

Deadline: **July 1** for **fall 2017** admission

5. Lebanon Valley University

Type: Small private liberal arts college

Location: Annville, Pennsylvania

Enrollment: 1,721 students

International Scholarships: International applicants may apply for [merit scholarships](#) ranging from 15,000 to 23,000 USD/year. Application requirements vary—see website.

Application requirements: TOEFL 77 or higher, high school transcript, and SAT.

Deadline: **May 15**
