Test Optional Colleges

Taking admissions tests overseas can be challenging! The good thing is that there are some colleges and universities in the U.S. that do not require international students to take standardized tests like the SAT and the ACT. The International Association for College Admissions Counselors (IACAC) has helpfully compiled a list of more than 200 test-optional colleges all around the United States to help you begin and refine your college search. Please note that the list is not exhaustive, and you should always confirm with the university itself!

College Search Spreadsheet

With over 4,000 institutions of higher learning in the United States, comparing colleges can get complex very quickly! It is common for students and parents to feel overwhelmed with all of the factors to take into consideration when choosing a college. Therefore, U.S. News and World Report has created a helpful spreadsheet specifically for international students to keep all the information in one place, and to help select and narrow down a list of universities to apply to.

Questions to Ask Colleges

When going to a college fair or an interview for a particular university, you should be prepared to answer questions from recruiters and admissions counselors. However, you should also come prepared with questions of your own! After all, the college search process is just as much about you finding a university that fits you as much as universities searching for students. Universities like to see students who are curious about their institution. However, it can be difficult to think of questions on the spot, so make sure you come prepared!
