

PROJECT OF HUNGARIAN FULBRIGHT ALUMNI ACCEPTED AS FINALIST

A project submitted by a group of Hungarian Fulbright Alumni, led by Prof. Tamás Csörgő has been accepted as finalist in the Alumni Engagement Innovation Fund competition.

The "Circles of Self-Education in Science: Innovative Methods to Mentor Talents" program aims to set up a a new form of science club. Based on the traditions of science education, on innovative applications of modern, internet based communication tools, a proven model will be extendedfrom the local to a national level.



Emphasis is placed on finding talent in remote, marginalized communities. Camps will be organized in small villages fighting for the survival of their schools in the face of low funding, and Science Clubs in towns where mentoring from active scientists has not yet been organized.
