MOORE (PA) OFFERING AN INTERNATIONAL MERIT-BASED SCHOLARSHIP



International Merit-based Scholarship:

Up to \$18,000 awarded annually to eligible first-year students and up to

\$12,000 awarded annually to eligible transfer students, upon acceptance into Moore's undergraduate program.

Scholarships are based on portfolio, academic achievement and TOEFL score (if required).

Automatically renewed for up to four years of full-time enrollment as long as student maintains a minimum cumulative GPA of between 2.5 and 3.0 per year, depending on amount of scholarship.
