## Study Opportunity Highlights

### Benjamin Franklin Transatlantic Fellows Summer Institute

U.S. Embassy Budapest is accepting applications for the **2020 Benjamin Franklin Transatlantic Fellows Summer Institute**. This is an intensive short-term



exchange program which enables teenagers to explore U.S. foreign policy priorities such as youth engagement, support for democracy and civil society, and economic prosperity. The Institute will take place at **Purdue University**, in West Lafayette, Indiana in July 2020.

All costs, including domestic and international travel, will be covered by the U.S. Embassy Budapest. **Students must be 16, 17 or 18 years of age** (born between June 22, 2002, and June 22, 2004) at the time of the program start, to be eligible for participation in the program.

### Study of the U.S. Institutes (SUSI)

The [Embassy of the United States of America](#) and the [Hungarian-American Fulbright Commission](#) are proud to announce the **2020 cycle of the Study of the U.S. Institutes (SUSI)**, which are short term special grants for [scholars](#), [students](#) and [teachers](#) funded by the U.S. Department of State.

**Study of the U.S. Institutes (SUSI) for Scholars** - intensive post-graduate level academic programs with integrated study tours for **foreign university faculty and other scholars**. The programs provide scholars the opportunity to deepen their understanding of U.S. society, culture, values, and institutions. The program will take place at various colleges, universities, and institutions throughout the United States over the course of six weeks beginning in or after June 2020. In 2020, SUSI programs will be on the following themes: **American Culture and Values; Journalism and Media; Religious Freedom and Pluralism; U.S. Economics and Business; U.S. Foreign Policy; Youth, Workforce Development and Closing the Skills Gap.**

**Study of the U.S. Institutes (SUSI) for Secondary Educators** are intensive post-graduate level academic programs with integrated study tours whose purpose is to provide **foreign secondary school educators and administrators** the opportunity to deepen their understanding of U.S. society, culture, values, and institutions. The SUSIs for Secondary Educators will take place over the course of five weeks beginning in late May/early June 2020. Three Institutes for Secondary Educators will be offered, two with a focus on classroom teachers and the third with a focus on administrators including teacher trainers, curriculum developers, textbook writers, and ministry of education officials, among others.

**Study of the U.S. Institutes (SUSIs) for Student Leaders: Education and the Future of Work** is an intensive short-term academic program which will provide groups

of **undergraduate** student leaders with a deeper understanding of the United States while simultaneously enhancing their leadership skills. The Institute, hosted by the University of Massachusetts-Boston, will explore how technology, the job economy, and skill based education are interconnected in the United States. The Institute will expose participants to global issues in the context of the future of work by examining educational, social, and economic trends. Topics will include, but are not limited to, communication, entrepreneurship, globalization and urbanization, innovation and technology, organizational development and management, skills development, and reskilling and retraining.

## **Fulbright Teaching Excellence and Achievement Program**

The **Fulbright Teaching Excellence and Achievement (Fulbright TEA) Program for Secondary Education on Media Literacy** will provide fellowships to **international secondary school teachers** from Eastern Europe and Central Asia to participate in a six-week **non-degree, non-credit academic program** at a U.S. university. This is a short term professional development program in the United States in either **fall of 2020 or spring of 2021**.

Teachers who are selected to participate in the Fulbright TEA Program will: (1) Participate in advanced undergraduate or graduate level classes at a U.S. host university; (2) Observe classes, co-teach, and share their expertise with U.S. colleagues in U.S. secondary schools; (3) Participate in an online professional learning community with other participants to share best practices and other elements of host and home country educational systems; and (4) Take part in other education and cultural activities while on program in the United States.

This is a program sponsored by the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs (ECA), with funding provided by the U.S. Government and administered by IREX.

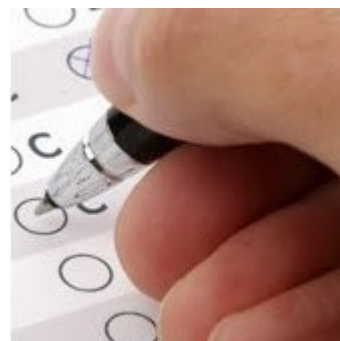
