



Attention student-athletes: the @NCAA has announced flexibility in their eligibility for the 2021-22 school year. International student-athletes enrolling in a Division I or II school during the 2021-22 academic year will be academically eligible if they complete 16 core-course units (English, math, science) in high school with at least a 2.3 (DI) or 2.2 (DII) grade-point average in those courses. These standards will be considered automatic waivers, which means students meeting these criteria are academically eligible to receive an athletics scholarship, as well as practice and compete in their first year at an NCAA member school. **Early Action Deadline:** November 10, 2020 at 11:59pm ET **Regular Decision Deadline:** January 12, 2021 at 11:59pm ET

The YYGS application is now open, and students in grades 10 or 11 (or international equivalent) from all around the world are welcome to apply! Experience life as a university student at Yale while attending an academic session of your choosing. Here's what you need to know:
