University of Missouri

University of Missouri is a public institution that was founded in 1839. It has a total undergraduate enrollment of 27,654, its setting is urban, and the campus size is 1,262 acres. It utilizes a semester-based academic calendar. 103. Its in-state tuition and fees are \$9,509 (2015-16); out-of-state tuition and fees are \$25,166 (2015-16).

Students at the University of Missouri live in a unique botanical garden, with more than 40,000 plants across campus. More than a third of high school seniors from Missouri attend Mizzou each year, and all freshmen must live on campus. As the only Division I-A sports school in the state, the Missouri Tigers teams are a big focus of campus life (US News).

University of Southern Maine

University of Southern Maine is a public institution that was founded in 1878. It has a total undergraduate enrollment of 6,628, its setting is urban, and the campus size is 142 acres. It utilizes a semester-based academic calendar. Its in-state tuition and fees are \$8,920 (2015-16); out-of-state tuition and fees are \$21,280 (2015-16) (US News).
