Schools in Focus

Brandeis University

Boston, Massachusetts

Brandeis University, ranked 34th in the nation, is a small research university located in suburban Boston. Brandeis meets 100% of demonstrated financial need for international students who are admitted. Additionally, the university is offering two new scholarship programs starting this year: one focused on interdisciplinary study of the natural sciences and one focused on interdisciplinary studies of the humanities. The application requires the TOEFL and the SAT or ACT, and operates through the common application system. Deadlines are November 1 for early decision and January 1 for regular decision. University of Hawaii Manoa

Honolulu, Hawaii

The EdUSAcademy at the University of Hawaii Manoa offers a unique "Land, Sea, and Space-themed" program. Students experience university life and are introduced to Oceanography, Marine Biology, Geology, Tropical Agriculture, and Astronomy. The program includes content-based English classes, regular exchange with university students, theme-related lectures by university professors, visits to other campuses, cultural workshops and activities, and educational field trips. Tulane Law School, located in New Orleans, Louisiana, is uniquely positioned to prepare students with an exposure to the common law tradition, practiced throughout much of the United States, as well as the civil law tradition. Tulane seeks to recruit qualified law students with diverse backgrounds from around the world. This opportunity provides students with a minimum \$20,000 tuition waiver with potential for the waiver to approach full tuition.

The program has the following guidelines: 1. Tulane Law School (New Orleans, Louisiana) offers tuition waivers to students who are being advised at an EducationUSA center and seek to pursue a Master of Laws (LLM) degree at Tulane University Law School. The tuition waiver is awarded to students who are admitted to Tulane Law and are nominated by an EducationUSA advisor or colleague. 2. Tulane Law will make award decisions based upon the nominations presented by the EducationUSA advisors.

York College of Pennsylvania International Merit Scholarship

York, Pennsylvania

York College of Pennsylvania, a relatively inexpensive, medium-sized college located in Southeastern Pennsylvania, offers a generous merit scholarship to qualifying international applicants.

Known as the Sanjay Parekh scholarship, the award ranges between \$8,000 and \$16,000 (over 4 years) and is granted based on the student's secondary school academic achievement. It is open to first time full time resident students seeking F-1 student visa status applying for an undergraduate degree. Applicants must be accepted by June 1st to be considered. Scholarship recipients will be

selected and notified by mid-June. Applicants must have a minimum 3.2 GPA or equivalent to be considered.

Georgetown Offers Huge Scholarship

Washington, D.C.

Georgetown University's Master of Arts in German and European Studies Program is actively recruiting EU citizens to begin their 2-year full time Master's program in fall 2017.

The Master of Arts in German and European Studies is designed to enable students to combine a deep and abiding interest in Europe with a knowledge base and skill set that will open up new and attractive career opportunities in the public, NGO, private, and higher education sectors.

For EU citizens who are granted p to 6 months of funding from Fulbright-Schuman, the BMW Center will offer a one-fourth scholarship over the entire period of study (four semesters totaling approximately \$24,000). For EU citizens who are granted 7 months or more of funding from Fulbright-Schuman, the BMW Center will offer one-half scholarship over the entire period of study (four semesters, totaling approximately \$48,000). In order to qualify, students must submit separate and complete applications to both the Fulbright-Schuman Program and Georgetown University's Master of Arts in German and European Studies (MAGES) by December 1st at 12 PM Brussels time. Students must be awarded both a grant from Fulbright-Schuman and admission to the MAGES program for the same academic year. For more information about Fulbright-Schuman, click here. Georgetown also offers merit-based scholarships for competitive international candidates, which typically range from 1/4 to 3/4 scholarship. In addition to this, the application fee will be waived for individuals who submit a complete application by December 1, 2016. Contact Carolina Solms-Baruth to request a fee waiver.
