Happy New Year's from the EducationUSA staff! While 2016 has come to a close, many applications for fall admission to U.S. colleges and universities are still open. Check out the list of schools in focus we have included below, many of which offer need and merit based scholarships to international students.

On the topic of scholarship, the College Board has just published two great resources for high school students considering further study in the U.S.: a [comprehensive list](#) of the nation's most generous colleges—which names the colleges that provide 100% of demonstrated financial need—and statistics on how much aid other universities provide to international students. You might not have heard of all of the most generous schools, but they are all well worth investigating. The [University of Rochester](#), the [Illinois Institute of Technology](#), and [Mount Holyoke College](#) all make the top ten.

Universities in the U.S. want to make it clear to international students that they are an important part of university communities. Schools in Focus

1. University of Wisconsin, Platteville

Type: Medium-sized public university

Location: 3.5 hrs. north of Chicago

Enrollment: 8,712 students

International Scholarships: Up to 8,000 USD per year, renewable each year. Students have the opportunity to work 20 hours per week

Application requirements: TOEFL 64 or higher, no SAT or ACT required

Deadline: June 1 for fall 2017 admission

2. University of Findlay

Type: Small private Christian liberal arts college

Location: Northwest Ohio

Enrollment: 3,700 students

International Scholarships: Two EducationUSA Global Scholar awards for four years' full tuition
Scholarship requirements: TOEFL 79 or higher, GPA 3.75 or higher, recommendation from EdUSA adviser, and essay on the topic, "How I can be an ambassador for my country in the United States?"

Deadline: **February 15, 2017**

3. Pittsburg State University

Type: Medium-sized public university

Location: Pittsburg, Kansas

Enrollment: 7,479 students

International Scholarships: Different amounts offered through the honors program up to 9,500 USD per year, renewable each year.

Application requirements: TOEFL 68 or higher, GPA 3.5 or higher, ACT 28 or SAT 1310 or higher

Deadline: **January 15, 2017.**

4. Marian University

Type: Small private liberal arts

Location: Indianapolis, Indiana

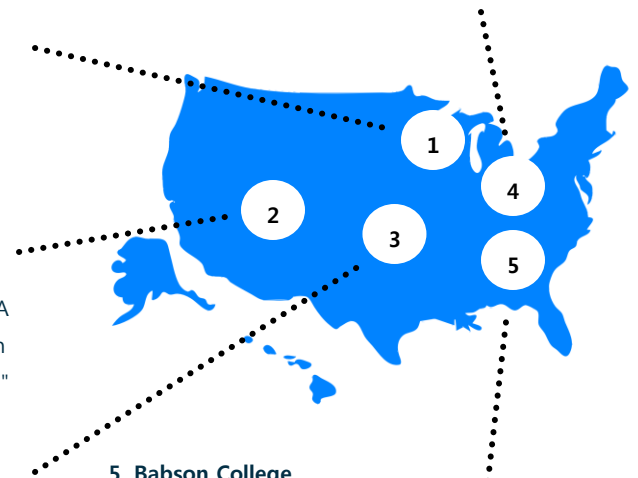
Enrollment: 2,771 students

International Scholarships: Academic and athletic merit scholarships from 6,000 USD to full tuition

Application requirements: Requirements for scholarships vary. All applications require TOEFL 69 or higher plus an essay, recommendation, and application form. SAT/ACT is optional.

Deadline: June 1 for fall 2017 admission

5. Babson College

Type: Small private liberal arts

Location: Wellesley, Massachusetts

Enrollment: 2,771 students

International Scholarships: A range of need *and* merit based scholarships are available for qualifying international students. Learn more [here](#).

Application requirements: Common app., Babson app. with supplemental essays, SAT or ACT, two letters of recommendation, and TOEFL of over 100.

Deadline: **January 15** for general applications,

Feb. 1 for scholarship applications
