Schools in Focus

1. Northern State University (NEW!)

Type: Small public university

Location: Aberdeen, South Dakota

Enrollment: 3,622 students

International Scholarships: Up to 12,000 USD per year scholarship for students who score over 30 on the ACT. [Music scholarships](#) also available.

Application requirements: ACT and GPA requirements vary for different scholarships. See website.

Deadline: March 1 for fall 2017 admission

2. Iowa State University

Type: Small private Christian liberal arts college

Location: Ames, Iowa

Enrollment: 3,660 students

International Scholarships: From 4,000 to 8,000 USD per year, renewable

Scholarship requirements: Students who have demonstrated outstanding academic and community achievement, and who fill out [this additional form](#), are considered.

Deadline: March 1 for fall 2017 admission

3. Georgia College (NEW!)

Type: Medium-sized public liberal arts

Location: Milledgeville, Georgia

Enrollment: 6,230 students

International Scholarships: The college offers an international student scholarship that goes up to 18,000 USD per year. The scholarship application form is included in the general application.

Application requirements: TOEFL 79 or higher, SAT or ACT required.

Deadline: April 1 for fall 2017 admission

4. Coe College (NEW!)

Type: Small private liberal arts

Location: Cedar Rapids, Iowa

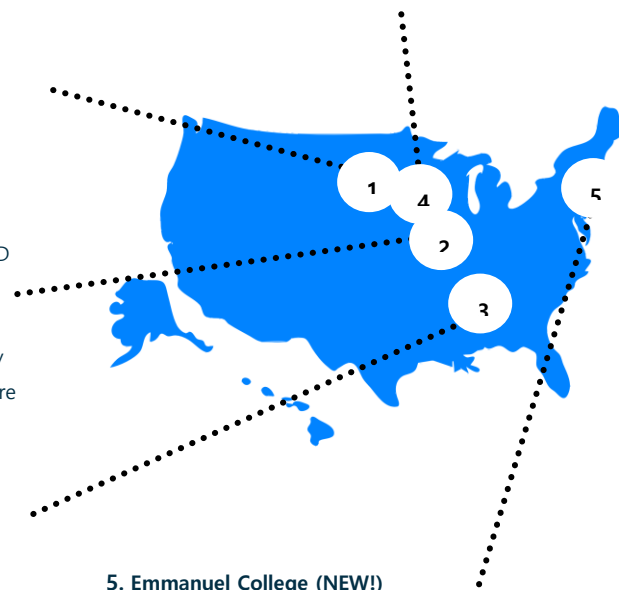
Enrollment: 1,300 students

International Scholarships: Merit scholarships up to 26,000 USD per year.

Application requirements: Scholarship eligibility is based on SAT score and high school grades

Deadline: March 1 for fall 2017 admission

5. Emmanuel College (NEW!)

Type: Small private liberal arts

Location: Boston, Massachusetts

Enrollment: 2,500 students

International Scholarships: International students who apply before February 15 are automatically considered for a range of merit scholarships.

Deadline: February 15 for fall 2017 admission.
