Lehigh University Scholarship

Thanks to a generous gift from alumnus Paul S. Levy '69 and his wife Karen, the brightest international students have access to a Lehigh education, regardless of their financial circumstances. The Levy Scholarship, a four-year scholarship that is awarded based on merit to highly qualified international undergraduate students, includes:

- Full tuition for four years
- Room and board for four years
- Annual book stipend
- Round trip air/transportation

- Monthly living expenses stipend
- Research support
- Internship or study abroad opportunities

We are looking for international students who are in the top tier of their class. Students must possess academic aptitude, intellectual depth and leadership qualities. Recipients must also: • be a non-U.S. citizen; and be offered admission to Lehigh as an undergraduate student.

The Levy Scholarship is available to students who are offered admission to any of Lehigh's undergraduate colleges including the College of Arts and Sciences, College of Business and Economics, and the P.C. Rossin College of Engineering and Applied Science.

Undergraduate applicants will be eligible for consideration for the Levy Scholarship if they have met the admissions requirements and have been admitted to Lehigh. No additional requirement beyond application for admission is necessary. All full-time admitted international students will be considered.
