
University of the Incarnate Word (UW) offers academic scholarships to first year students based on high school grades and SAT/ACT scores. Awards range from \$5,000 - \$12,000 and are renewable for four years. First year students who graduate(d) from a Catholic High School receive an additional \$2,000 scholarship, which is also renewable for four years. All undergraduate degree seeking students receive a one-time International Scholarship of \$1,000.

UNIVERSITY OF HARTFORD OFFERS DUAL DEGREE ENGINEERING AND BUSINESS DEGREE



University of Hartford's E2M program offers a 63 credit dual degree in engineering and business administration. Many courses are offered online or in the traditional class room setting. Students have the opportunity to select which courses they want to do online or in the class room. You may qualify for waiving some core courses depending upon undergraduate curriculum and achievement.

The E2M program is the first dual-degree program in Connecticut in engineering and management, enabling full- and part-time engineering graduate students to earn both a Master of Engineering (M.Eng.) and a Master of Business Administration (M.B.A.) by taking a total of 63 credits. This is 18 fewer credits than if the degrees were pursued separately. With four different engineering specialties from which to choose, the E2M program is as flexible as it is efficient.
